What are your academic, creative, and/or scholarly qualifications? What departmental activities or services do you participate in?
3. A brief curriculum vitae to include service/work experience.
4. A signed release form.
5. For the Promising Scholar Awards you must submit (in addition to the items listed above) one piece of writing no longer than ten pages (poets may submit up to ten poems).
